Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible, applicants must be a U.S. citizen, current high school senior or college freshman, sophomore, or junior planning to attend a two- or four-year college in the fall for at least 12 credit hours. All applicants must be under a doctor's care for spina bifida, a spinal cord injury, or transverse myelitis.

Application Deadline

The 180 Medical Scholarship Program runs from January 1, 2012 - June 1, 2012. All materials must be postmarked by June 1, 2012. Application materials must be mailed in one packet.
